Fire/Fuels

Fire is continuing to repair prescribed burn and wildfire control lines. We are finishing up maintenance of equipment and getting all admin work submitted for wildfire and prescribe fire reporting.

Recreation

Cobb Ridge Campground has been busy, busy, busy and the Chadwick trails are being ridden a great deal. We like to see the users use their National Forests and be able to share with others. We are gearing up to open North Fork campground - the water system has been turned on this week and testing is being done to insure safe water for our users. Planned opening date is May 15. We will have a new host at North Fork this summer so we are excited for her to start.

North Fork Recreation Area: Boulders have been placed to keep users on the pavement. In the near future some a new gate will be installed at entrance a CC Highway and 3 others in the day use area.

Horton Trailhead, Collins Ridge Trailhead, Hay Hollow Trailhead: JR Rhodes, Wilderness/Non-motorized manager, has been working with the Ridge Runner Chapter of the MO Back-Country Horseman to install hitching rails and mounting blocks. Thank you BCH!

Lookout Road (near Cobb Ridge Campground): The Forest Service has retained jurisdiction of the road from where the pavement ends at Cobb Ridge to just before the Bull Creek bridge. This road has become extremely rough. Currently we advise people to use caution if using that road and that is suitable for 4WD vehicles, anything lower could drag bottom.

Quail Forever

Looking to make a positive impact on habitat, wildlife, and their local community, the Heart of the Ozarks Chapter of Quail Forever has been hard at work in Howell, Douglas and Oregon counties since 2008!
